Do not eat or drink anything 6 hours before the test. And depending on your doctor's orders, you may need to be off your acid suppression drugs (Dexilant, Tagamet, Zantac, Carafate, Prilosec, Aciphex, Pepcid, Nexium, Prevacid, Protonix, etc.) 5 days before the test. You may take your other medications.

A nurse or technician will perform the test. Your nasal cavity will be numbed to minimize discomfort as the small probe is placed through the nose and into the esophagus. It is connected to a small recording device that will record the acid levels in the esophagus over a 24-hour period. You will be asked to keep a diary of your activities and symptoms throughout the day and will need to return it with the recording device in order to complete the test. Your doctor will review the reflux episodes and discuss them with you at a later date.

You are encouraged to continue your normal activities so that your doctor can get a realistic picture of what is taking place in your esophagus. Do not take a bath, shower or swim.

If you know how to bring on your symptoms, you are encouraged to do so.

You will be able to drive yourself home. You will return the following day to have the probe removed and please remember the diary. Your results should be ready in 14 days.
